What Degree Can I Get at Snow?

As a criminal justice major, you will want a degree that will transfer to a four-year college or university - either an Associate of Science (AS) or an Associate of Arts (AA) degree. In Utah, you can complete a Bachelor's degree in criminal justice at Weber State University, Southern Utah University, and Utah Valley University.

What Classes Should I Take?

You will want to take the following types of classes: General Education + Major Requirements + Recommended Classes + Electives. General Education classes are designed to provide you with a broad knowledge of many subjects such as Fine Arts, Literature, Biology, etc. Major Requirements are classes that you are expected to take *as a freshman and a sophomore* so that you can transfer as a junior in your major. Recommended classes are those that we believe will provide key background for your major, even though they are not required. Electives are courses that you want to take "*just to learn stuff!*" To earn an AS or an AA degree, you will need 63 total credits, and about half of these will be General Education credits.
