What Classes Should I Take?

You will want to take the following types of classes: General Education + Major Requirements + Recommended Classes + Electives. General Education classes are designed to provide you with a broad knowledge of many subjects such as Fine Arts, Literature, Biology, etc. Major Requirements are classes that you are expected to take **as a freshman and sophomore** so that you can transfer as a junior in your major. These courses (called “prerequisites”) will vary from one college to another. For instance, the University of Utah requires College Algebra (Math 1050), while Utah State requires Statistics (Math1040). Recommended Classes are those that we believe will provide key background for your major, even though they are not required. Electives are courses that you want to take “*just to learn stuff!*” To earn an AS or an AA degree, you will need 63 total credits. About half of these will be General Education credits.
