

What Degree Can I Get?

Music majors at Snow will want to complete either an Associate of Science (AS) or an Associate of Arts (AA) degree. These are transfer degrees, designed to prepare you to transfer to a four-year college and work on a Bachelor's degree. It is recommended that those seeking a degree in Music Education obtain an Associate of Science degree, while those seeking a degree in Music Performance are encouraged to obtain an Associate of Arts. Students who major in music find it an ideal preparation for entrance into professions such as teaching, performance, music therapy, sound engineering or arts management.



Snow College Music Department

The music area at Snow College was named the Horne School of Music in January 2002, by virtue of a substantial gift to the college from the Horne family. It is accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music and is one of only 23 two-year programs in the country that has achieved this status. The Horne School of Music at Snow College was also recently named an "All Steinway School," making Snow College the only institution of its size in the world to receive this designation. Beginning in August, 2003, the Horne School of Music has been housed along with the Snow College Theatre Arts program in a \$17 million performing arts structure known as the Eccles Center for the Performing Arts.
