The following honors classes will be offered next semester, and we hope you'll find one that fits into your schedule. See the honors webpage or the Snow College catalog for course descriptions.

Bolded courses are honors core classes. Remember that to graduate with honors, a student needs 12 credits of honors classes including 3 credits from English 2014 and 3 credits from English 2150 or 2160.

Honors Biology (Biology 2100)	Section 1	1 credit hour	M 3:30-4:20	Paul Gardner	None	This is a great class for honors students interested in health science professions; however, all students will find value in the class.
Intermediate Composition: Honors Thesis (English 2014)	Section 2	3 credit hours	MWF 10:30-11:20	Greg Wright	English 2	If you have English 1010 this semester, taking 2014 is a natural choice for the spring. This course substitutes for English 2010 on the GE worksheet. Because only honors students are allowed in this class, bring an add card to the honors director to register for it.
Intellectual Traditions of the West—Modern World (English 2160)	Section 1	3 credit hours	TR 10:00-11:15	Rachel Keller	Humanities or Fine Arts	This is the second half of Intellectual Traditions, but you do not have to have taken the first half to take English 2160. This class can count for either Fine Arts or Humanities GE credit.
American National Government (Political Science 1100)	Section 3	3 credit hours	TR 8:00-9:20	Scott Wyatt	American Institutions	This course includes a required trip to the East Coast at the end of the semester. Consult the instructor for this year's exact cost, but in years past the price has been around \$500-600.
Civil War to Civil Rights (Political Science 2400)	Section 1	3 credit hours	TR 10:30-11:45	Scott Wyatt, Ivo Peterson, and David Allred	Oral Communications	This exciting, interdisciplinary class is still receiving final approval and will be listed on the class schedule soon. For the 150 th anniversary of the Civil War, the class will explore the development of civil rights in America from political, legal, literary, and oratorical perspectives.
