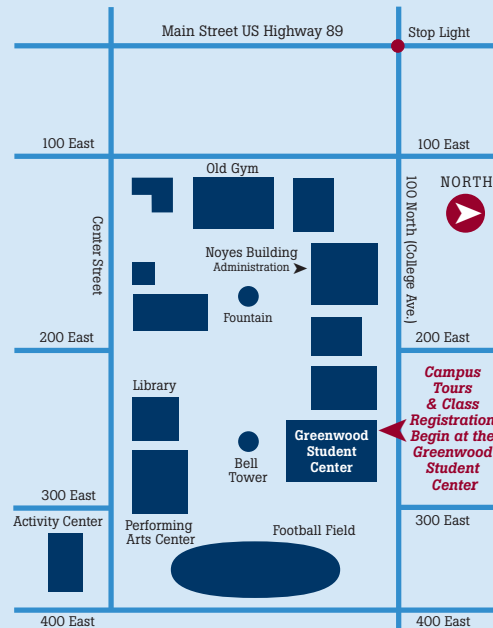

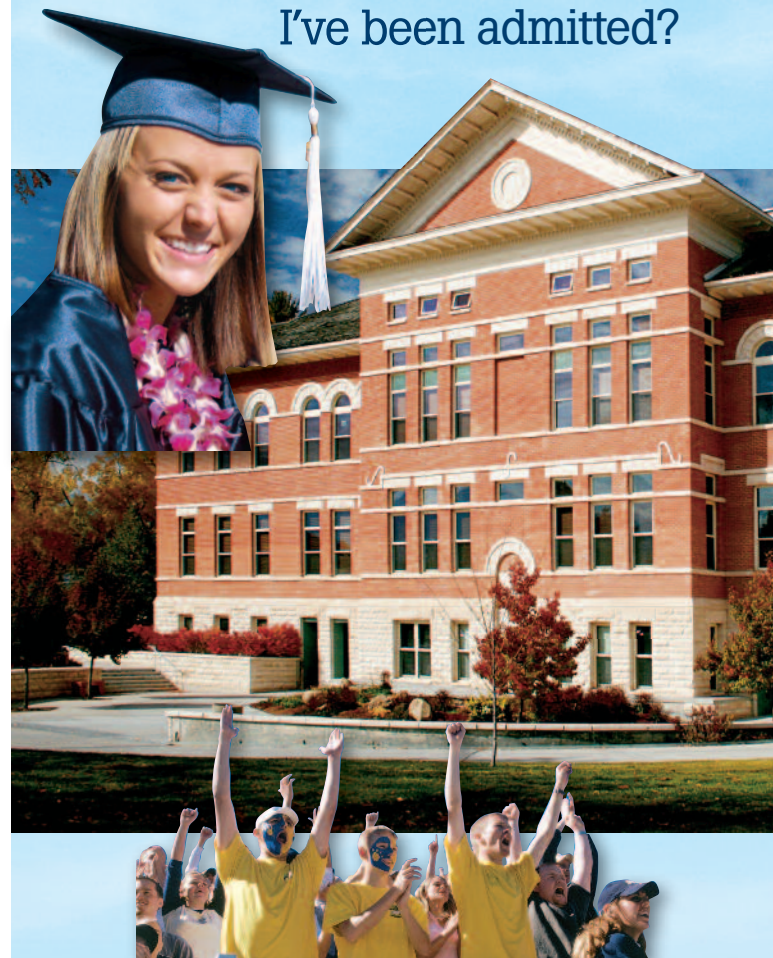

Snow College Next Steps

What do I do now that I've been admitted?



Congratulations, you're about to become part of one of the greatest 2-year colleges in America.

Now that you've been accepted to Snow College, here are some important items you'll need to think about over the next few weeks or months. Remember, if you have any questions, help is only a phone call or email away. So, here are your next steps:

Class Registration and Advising

Until you've been officially admitted, you will not be able to register for classes. We require all entering freshmen to meet with an academic advisor prior to the start of each semester. This is for your own good, and it will relieve a lot of stress related to selecting the right classes. (In fact, assessment may be required before you can register for some classes.) By meeting one-on-one with an advisor you might also "speed" your way along to a successful college career. Your advisement session will focus on your field of study or major, class options, personal interests and even transfer possibilities and opportunities for the future. Taking advantage of our great academic advisement team can actually save you time spent in college, which in turn will save you money. It will also ensure an adequate work load semester to semester and prepare you to transfer to the university or 4-year college of your choice.

Actual class registration for new, incoming freshmen will begin in late Spring. You'll be notified of the exact date. **Please call first to make an appointment with an advisor.** We don't want you driving hours to see us and find we're booked with appointments. Once you've met with your advisor and have a tentative schedule, you're ready to register. It's simple! If you're on campus,

you can go directly to the registration windows on the second floor of the Greenwood Student Center. The folks at the registration windows will go out of their way to take care of you. If coming to campus isn't an option for you, or you just prefer alternative methods, you may register on line or by telephone. Which ever method you choose, register early to take advantage of a greater class selection.

What about a catalog and registration materials...? When you arrive on campus to register, you will receive a new college catalog, course schedule and other materials free. If you register electronically, you may view the schedule and catalog on-line. If you would like a new catalog mailed to you the cost is approximately \$4. Please call the Registrars Office for more information.

- **Tip:** By registering early, you'll have the best selection of classes. As soon as you get officially admitted to Snow, call advisement for a counseling appointment. Their hours are typically 9 am to 4 pm Monday through Friday (except for holidays and weekends). Remember to call first before coming to campus to register. Don't just show up without an appointment—we may not be able to fit you in, especially during busy summer months.





2 Buying Books

Now that you've registered for classes, you need to think about buying books that coincide with those courses. Books can be purchased in the Snow Bookstore located downstairs in the Greenwood Student Center. Be smart and buy early if possible. If your books aren't in stock yet when you register, plan to get them as soon as you arrive at Snow for new student orientation in August.

.....

● **Tip:** Don't be afraid of buying used books. They cost lots less. They also go in a hurry, so buy them as soon as you possibly can. Books are expensive and getting more expensive every year, so plan for it. You might complain about the cost, but learn to live with it. It's a fact of college life.



3 Housing

Have you already made housing arrangements for the upcoming year? If not, now is the time to find yourself a place to live. Snow and the city of Ephraim offer a wide variety of housing options ranging from on-campus dorms to off-campus apartments and even houses. Check the Housing Office or our web site www.snow.edu for more information. If you need an application for on-campus housing or a list of off-campus facilities, call or email us now.

● **Tip:** Never rent an apartment "sight-unseen". Come see the options in person as early as possible. Some of the more popular places go in a hurry (by December or January in some cases). Housing is one of the keys to a happy, successful college experience, so take it seriously and look early. Costs in Ephraim will range from about \$1500 to \$2200 per school year, not counting food.



4 Start Smart New Student Orientation

Our new student orientation program is called Start Smart – because that's what you'll be if you attend... Smart! This is a 3-day event that will take place the end of August right before fall semester begins. There will also be additional required sessions in September and October. You'll receive more specific information about Start Smart as summer goes along, so watch your mail.

During Start Smart, you'll have a chance to find your classes, talk to faculty and staff, mingle with current students (both sophomores and freshmen like yourself), and attend some very helpful information sessions. Not only is this a great way to jump into college, but by registering for Start Smart and then attending the entire program, you might receive at least one full college credit. It really is Smart to Start Smart!

● **Tip:** Don't assume you can just show up on the day Start Smart begins and be part of the program. Space is limited and usually only those who have signed up beforehand will be eligible to receive credit. So take responsibility and sign up for Start Smart when you register for classes. Just ask your advisor about it.

5 Financial Aid and Jobs

You probably already know that Snow offers hundreds of grants, loans and campus jobs through the Federal Financial Aid Program. If you haven't already applied, it's not too late, but please do it now. The Application (Free Application For Federal Student Aid) is available at your local high school or through our office. This year, the government would like as many people as possible to apply on line at www.fafsa.ed.gov. If you need assistance applying, you can always call us at 1-800-848-3399 or (435) 283-7133 and we'll answer all your questions about internet application and even help you through the process.

Now... If you've already applied for financial aid, actual notification about financial aid awards won't go out until June or July. If you are mailed any additional forms to complete for our office, please complete those immediately so we can process your award ASAP.

Jobs... Many of you will be interested in working a part-time job when you come to Snow College. Our employment office is located in the Financial Aid Office on the second floor of the Greenwood Student Center. Most jobs will not be posted or available until school starts in August. However, you may go on line to check our job postings at any time at www.snow.edu.

● **Tip:** To receive your first financial aid check, you must have two instructors sign an Attendance Verification Form, which will be available at the Financial Aid Office early on the first day of classes. This form MUST be returned to the Snow College Cashier before you will receive any money. If you have questions, you can always call our Financial Aid Office before school begins. Plan to show up at Snow with enough money to get you by until your first check is available. Don't get caught unable to buy books, or worse – food.



6 Paying Tuition Fees and Other Required Expenses

Tuition and student fees are two separate items. Tuition pays for your classes (based on the credits you take), and student fees go to help support various facilities and student programs such as the Activity Center, theatre productions, computer labs, insurance, etc. Student fees must be paid when you register for classes. Tuition isn't due until school starts. In addition, you'll also need to pay a deposit when you sign up for an apartment or on-campus residence hall, and maybe even a special fee for some classes you might register for. The cashier can give you a complete list of fees you owe the school once you have your class schedule. Also, read your housing contract carefully so you'll understand your payment schedule. If you plan to purchase a meal card on campus, you may do that at the Cashier's Office in the Student Center. Your on-campus housing information should give you a complete explanation of meal ticket options.

.....

● **Tip:** Make sure you are prepared to pay at least your student fees at the time of registration. If your fees aren't paid within 5 days of class registration, you may lose your schedule.
