

What Degree Can I Get?

Art majors at Snow will want to complete either an Associate of Science (AS) or an Associate of Arts (AA) degree. Students who are seeking an (AA) need to complete two semesters of one foreign language. The BA requires four semesters. The BFA (Bachelor's of Fine Arts) does not require a foreign language. These are transfer degrees, designed to prepare you to transfer to a four-year college and work on a Bachelor's degree. Students who major in art find it an ideal preparation for entrance into programs in preparation for careers in: environmental design, graphic design, photography, entertainment design, art publication, industrial design, illustration, art education, fine arts.



Which Classes Should I Take?

Students who wish to transfer to a four-year institution should take the courses recommended below. Note that these recommendations represent a minimal commitment to studying art. Students who have a transfer institution in mind should consult that institution's Art Department regarding course transferability as soon as possible. Students who complete an emphasis in art can expect to successfully transfer as a junior to a university art program being as well prepared or better than if they had begun at the university level.
