

What Degree Can I Get?

English majors at Snow will want to complete either an Associate of Science (AS) or an Associate of Arts (AA) degree. These are transfer degrees, designed to prepare you to transfer to a four-year college and work on a Bachelor's degree. Most four-year institutions offer both a BA and BS in English. Be aware that BA degrees require at least two years of one foreign language. Students who major in English find it an ideal preparation for entrance into professions such as Teaching, Research, Editing, Technical Writing, Creative Writing.

Students who wish to transfer to a four-year institution should take the courses recommended below. Note that these recommendations represent a minimal commitment to studying English.
