Resources for Undocumented Students

General Overview

- Undocumented students may be eligible for in-state resident tuition at USHE degree-granting institutions through **HB 144** when they meet the following qualifications:
 - Attend a UT high school for 3 years or more
 - Graduated from a UT high school with a diploma or GED
 - Submit an official high school transcript with a graduation date listed
- International students may be eligible for in-state resident tuition at USHE degree-granting institutions through **HB 118** when they meet the following qualifications:
 - o Foreign nationals legally admitted to the U.S. with visas such as F-1, H-4, J-1, etc.
 - Attend a UT high school for 3 years or more
 - o Graduated from a UT high school with a diploma or GED
 - Submit an official high school transcript with a graduation date listed
- Students may be eligible for in-state resident tuition at USHE degree-granting institutions
 through HB 102 when the student submits an application for or has been granted refugee
 status, humanitarian parole, temporary protected status, or asylum.
- Under **SB 253** (2015), any student who graduates from a Utah high school is NOT required to provide proof of lawful U.S. presence to be awarded privately funded scholarships in public Utah colleges and universities.
- An SSN is not required for a student to apply and enroll in a Utah college.
- Students can attend a technical college while in high school (dual enrollment) tuition free. Supplies and other fees may apply.
- Technical Education (technical colleges) is a college option and offers affordable tuition rates, about \$2 per hour.
- Concurrent enrollment is a great way for a student to earn college credit at an affordable rate of \$5 per credit hour.
- Dream Centers help any student navigate the processes of college regardless of where they will attend college.
- College access program advisers are great resources and content experts to help a student navigate college.

FAQs

- Can an undocumented person obtain an ITIN?
 - Yes. ITINs are issued by the IRS specifically as a means to pay federal taxes. While the IRS issues them solely for this purpose, ITINs may sometimes be accepted for other purposes, such as for opening an interest-bearing bank account, in employment dispute settlements, or for obtaining a mortgage. - Can a student open a my529 with a Taxpayer Identification Number?
 - O Yes. Anyone who is at least 18 years old and possesses a valid Social Security or Taxpayer Identification Number. You do not have to be a Utah resident to open an account on behalf of a beneficiary. More information here: https://my529.org/benefits-of-my529/who-can-participate/
