GENERALLY

RECOMMENDATION. It is highly recommended that you read the Board of Regents Policy and Procedures R512 and Snow College's Residency Policy, along with the application and instruction sheet for further detail on residency eligibility. This will assist you in determining your eligibility under Utah law. This information will also advise you of the supporting documentation you must provide with your application. Remember to make early application to avoid missing the third week of the semester. Early filing will accommodate early notification of residency eligibility.

QUALIFYING AS A RESIDENT. There are a number of non-academic reasons for a move to Utah that allow the Registrar's Office to waive the time requirement to grant residency. You can find these exceptions to the general rule at the Registrar's Office webpage at www.snow.edu/residency. If you select "Residency" from the index on the right-hand panel, you will find detailed information on qualifying for resident status for tuition purposes.

A person's residency status can only be determined upon a complete statement of facts made by the individual. You must submit a complete residency packet by the end of the third week of the semester. A complete packet includes a residency application and all required evidence. Please note that all materials submitted as supporting documentation with a residency application become a permanent part of the applicant's residency file and will not be returned. Therefore, the applicant should submit photocopies of all supporting documentation.

An individual must be admitted and enrolled in classes at Snow College before an application for residency reclassification will be processed.

If the reclassification is denied, the student may appeal to the Vice President of Student Services. The student must file an appeal with the Vice President within 10 days of the Registrar's final decision. There is no appeal from the Vice President's decision.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Read <u>www.snow.edu/residency</u>.
- 2. Determine which residency circumstance applies to you.
- 3. Complete this application.
- 4. Submit the completed application by the end of the third week of the semester.
- 5. With the application:
 - a. submit a written declaration that you have relinquished residency in any other state;
 - b. submit sufficient objective evidence that you have taken overt steps to establish permanent residency in Utah and that you do not maintain a residence elsewhere; and
 - c. submit a declaration of financial independence to include documentation that you are not claimed as a dependent on the most recent tax returns of any person who is not a resident of Utah who claimed you in the past.

<u>APPLICATION DEADLINE</u>: The application and all documentation must be in the Registrar's Office by the end of the third week of the semester for which you are applying.

INSTRUCTIONS: Your resident status can be determined only upon a complete statement of facts made by you. Please read and carefully consider all questions before answering. You must submit a complete residency application with supporting documentation by the deadline. Even late or incomplete applications become a permanent part of the applicant's file at Snow College and will not be returned.

EVIDENCE: Please provide as much "Objective Evidence" as possible.
