Welcome to [Snow College's Electrical Apprenticeship Certificate!](#) Snow College's Electrical Apprenticeship program is designed to provide you with classroom-related and supplemental instruction for an apprenticeship program and to apply for licensure through the [Utah Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing \(DOPL\)](#).

The State of Utah requires electrical apprentices to have 576 classroom hours and 8,000 on-the-job training hours to become licensed Journeyman Electricians. Students also must pass the state Journeyman Electrician exam. Snow College does not provide on-the-job training nor act as a sponsor for apprentices. Individuals are responsible for finding their own employment. Snow College suggests that students work as licensed apprentice electricians before beginning this program. All electricians must register with the Utah State Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing (DOPL).

Snow College is accredited by the [Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities \(NWCCU\)](#).

Each state has set their own standards for licensure that are independent of graduating from Snow College. States may require additional course work or professional training.
