The faculty members are indeed “star performers” and everyone will enjoy hearing a repertoire of their favorite pieces.

- Founders Day Concert:** Please join us Friday, Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> at the annual Snow College Fine Arts Division Founder’s Day Concert. This event will feature the A Cappella Choir, Cadence, Jazz Orchestra, and the Wind Ensemble. We will be honoring two inductees into the Horne School of Music Hall of Fame, Anthony C. Lund and Laurie Carter. Lund was the first music teacher hired by Sanpete Stake Academy in 1894. He later graduated from Leipzig Conservatory, chaired the Music Department at Brigham Young University, and conducted the Mormon Tabernacle Choir. Carter, is Vice President for Student Affairs, Executive Director of Jazz Studies, and Legal Council for the Juilliard School in New York City. She has been instrumental in the success of Snow College’s artistic collaboration with Juilliard Jazz. She was the 2009 Snow College Commencement Speaker. Carter is also a member of the Snow College Fine Arts Division Advisory Board. Dr. Kim Christensen, chairman of the Department of Theatre Arts, will be the Master of Ceremonies for the event. The music promises to be spectacular.

- **The Mousetrap:** by Agatha Christie  
Directed by Brad V. Olsen November 17-20, 2010  
The author comes forth with another hit about a group of strangers stranded in a boarding house during a snowstorm, one of whom is a murderer. The suspects include the newly married couple that run the house, and the suspicions that are in their minds nearly wreck their perfect marriage. Others are a spinster with a curious background, an architect who seems better equipped to be a chef, a retired Army major, a strange little man who claims his car has overturned in a drift, and a jurist who makes life miserable for everyone. Into their midst comes a policeman, traveling on skis. He no sooner arrives, than the jurist is killed. Two down, and one to go. To get to the rationale of the murderer's pattern, the policeman probes the background of everyone present, and rattles a lot of skeletons. Another famous Agatha Christie switch finish! Chalk up another superb intrigue for the foremost mystery writer of her time.
