OUTSTANDING BUSINESS AND APPLIED TECHNOLOGY STUDENT

SHE SWITCHED TO ONLINE SECTIONS OF HER CLASSES, DOING ASSIGNMENTS AND TESTING DURING HER OFF-TREATMENT WEEKS. SHE CONTINUED HER TREATMENTS ALL THROUGH SPRING SEMESTER 2021. AFTER TWELVE TREATMENTS, SHE KICKED CANCERS BUTT AND IS NOW CANCER FREE.
